IMMIGRATION & VISA

EU AND A FEW OTHER COUNTRIES: A VALID PASSPORT OR IDENTITY CARD

If you are a national of one of the 28 European Union countries or 5 other countries listed below, an identity card or passport is sufficient to enter Belgium and reside here. Nevertheless upon arrival you are obliged to report to the municipal authorities (the Foreigners Registration Office of Ghent) to regularise your stay.

The 28 European Union countries are: Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, the Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden and United Kingdom.

The 5 other countries are: Iceland, Liechtenstein, Monaco, Norway and Switzerland.

ALL OTHER COUNTRIES: SCHENGEN VISA TYPE D

If you are a national of any other country and you wish to stay in Belgium for more than three months, you are subject to the visa requirements. An application for a Schengen visa type D can only be submitted with the Belgian diplomatic or consular authorities in the region where you reside.

Upon your authorised arrival in Belgium, you must report to the municipal authorities (the Foreigners Registration Office of Ghent) to regularise your stay.

Another possibility is to stay in a hotel or a youth hostel during the first days of your stay and to go and look for a room yourself. Check the UGent Housing Department's website for useful links.

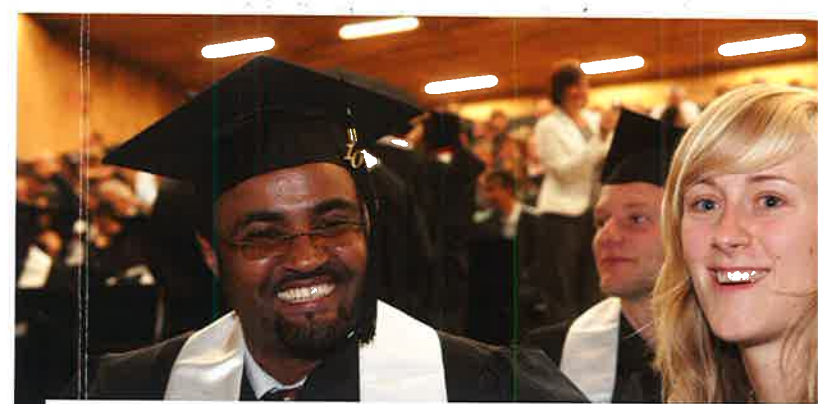

BY AIRPLANE

Belgium has several commercial airports but the main international airports are Brussels Airport and Charleroi Airport ('Brussels South').



BY TRAIN
